SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

- 1. How are worship and admiration different?
- **2.** In John 4:19–24 what do you think Jesus meant when he spoke about worshiping in "spirit and truth?" How should this affect our worship today?
- **3.** Read Matthew 4:8–10. How does Satan twist the concept of worship? How do people fall into this trap today? What does Jesus' response tell us about the value of worship in our lives?
- **4.** While worshiping, God invited the community to send Paul and Barnabas on a mission that would change the world—*see Acts* 13:1–3. What connection is there between worship and hearing from God?

LIVE IT OUT

This week engage in a practice or style of worship that is different from what you normally prefer. Consider how that practice brings people close to God and how it reflects God's character.

CONTEMPLATIVE PRACTICE JOURNALING

Take some time to journal about your experience of trying a style of worship different than your usual. Reflect on your worship preferences. How can they bless the broader church? When individual preferences are insisted upon, how can they become divisive and hinder unity?
